Spring Scholarship Application

Acceptable Forms of Citizenship

Students applying for scholarships included on the Spring Scholarship Application will be required to provide proof of citizenship documentation. Note that there are several scholarships administered on the Spring Scholarship Application that may have unique citizenship status restrictions.

- **Coca-Cola Leaders of Promise Scholarships, GEICO Pathway to Completion Associate's Degree Scholarships, Trustmark Workforce Development Scholarships, Mississippi Dowell Leadership Scholarship** and **Dr. Mary Hood Texas Region Scholarship** - require US Citizenship or US Permanent Resident status (generally following the same citizenship guidelines as the federal government in awarding student aid).
- **Global Leaders of Promise Scholarships, Pearson Scholarships for Higher Education** and **Richard L. Resurreccion Scholarships** - allow US Citizens, temporary residents, international students, and students who are members of Phi Theta Kappa chapters outside of the United States to apply.
- **Oberndorf Lifeline to Completion Scholarship** is open to all citizenship statuses.

Upon request, applicants are required to provide a copy of one or more of the document(s) listed below based on the citizenship status selected on your application.

- US Citizen/National (US Birth Certificate or US Passport)
 - Form FS-240 Certificate of Birth by a Foreign Service Post - individuals born on foreign soil during parental service.
 - Form N-560 or N-561 Certificate of Citizenship - individuals who derive US Citizenship through a parent.
 - Form N-550 or N-570 Certificate of Naturalization - individuals who have been naturalized.
- US Permanent Resident (Permanent Resident Card/Alien Registration Card 'Green Card', I-151 or I-551; Reentry Permit I-327; Foreign Passport with a temporary I-551 Stamp until permanent I-551 card is received)
- Temporary Resident (Employment Authorization Card I-766 or Work Permit 245-I)
- International Student attending college in the United States (Visa & I-20)
- Phi Theta Kappa member enrolled in associate degree program in Canada (Canadian Birth Certificate/Canadian Passport)
- Phi Theta Kappa member enrolled in associate degree program in a sovereign nation where a Phi Theta Kappa chapter exists (Birth Certificate or Passport)
- Asylee (Unexpired I-94 card with an Asylee stamp)
- Cuban-Haitian Entrant (Unexpired I-94 card with a Cuban-Haitian Entrant stamp)
- Humanitarian Parolee (Unexpired I-94 card with a Humanitarian Parolee stamp)
- Refugee (Unexpired I-94 card with a Refugee stamp or Refugee Travel Document I-571)
